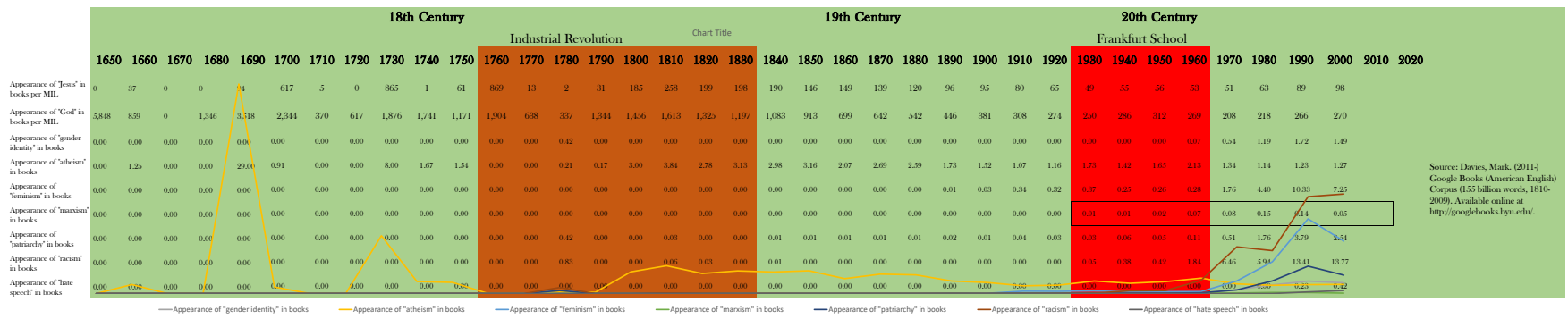


# Mapping the Rise of Feminism and Cultural Marxism in the West

## Nihilism

Suffrage: the right to vote in political elections.

Edmund Burke - But the age of chivalry is gone: that of sophisters, economists, and calculators, has succeeded; and the glory of Europe is extinguished forever. 1793

Charles Darwin - we're just animals.

Sigmund Freud - coined 'free sex' 'sex object' 'pleasure principle'

Frankfurt School born in the USA after Marxism rebounded here during WWII. Tangled Marxist Theory, Critical Theory, Culture Industry, 'political correctness', etc. in 1930s and 1940s prior to Feminist Movement, Woke.

Frederick Nietzsche - 'god is dead' 'self-defeat' 'morality is in our own hands' 'Hated his family - couldn't bear his mother, or stand his state, never married, no kids'

Karl Marx - 'share wives' 'inferiorhood is selfful' (Proletariat, providing Govt should take the place of the father role).

Rainbow Flag invented in 1978 in San Francisco

## Progressive Fascism, Social Justice

Marxist ideology taught in nearly every major liberal arts college in the US and West under the guise of 'social equity'. Millions taking to the streets every year with a flag of rainbow colors.

Jean-Paul Sartre - Marxist Philosopher - Had lifelong relationship with Simone de Beauvoir

Michel Foucault - Hated his dad, homosexual, never married, no kids, died of aids.

Woke: Front of Feminism 1913. Legal Subjection of Men, 1908. Addressed changes in law that dealt different punishments based on sex for the same crime. Ernest Bebbert Box

## Female Nihilism

Betty Friedan - 'the problem that has no name' (housewife). Women should compete with men for success and wealth.

Was a part of communist community prior to 1950s but worked hard to cover that up in later years.

Simone de Beauvoir - Wrote 'The Second Sex' in 1949. Claimed that men made up the 'take idea of feminine mystique'. Believed more than a socialist revolution was necessary to bring about women's liberation. 'No, we don't believe that any woman should have this choice. No woman should be authorized to stay at home to bring up her children. Society should be totally different. Women should not have that choice, precisely because if there is such a choice, too many women will make that one. It is a step of forcing women in a certain direction.'

Germaine Greer - Her radical ideas beyond equality and pushed for female superiority. 'When a woman may walk on the open streets of our cities alone, without mask or obstacle, at any pace she chooses, there will be no further need for this book.' Such a city must be an extremely totalitarian one for that to be possible. Said Feminism and Gay Liberation must combine. Married 5 years, divorced, no kids.

Kate Millet - 'Women are victims' Wrote 'Temptation Manifesto'. Beat by her father who was an alcoholic that abandoned the family. Had 'open marriage' with Japanese man while a lesbian, later divorced, no kids.

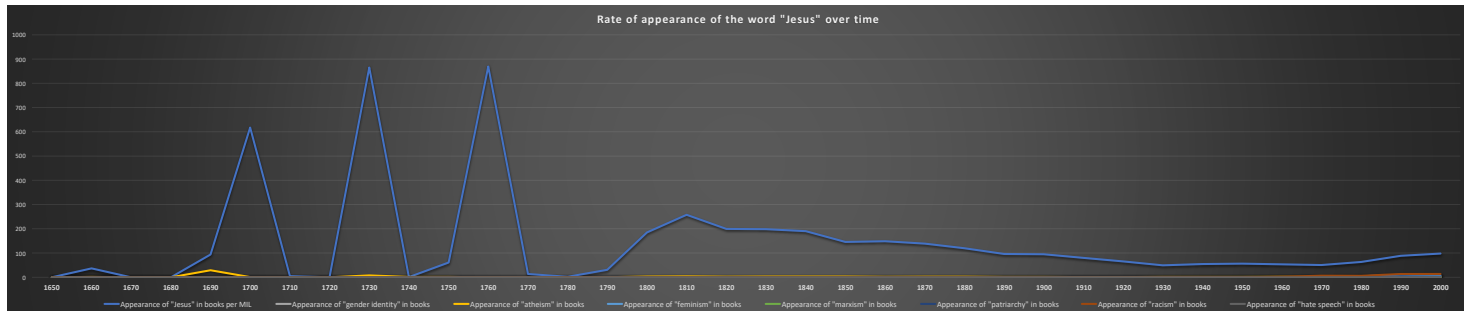
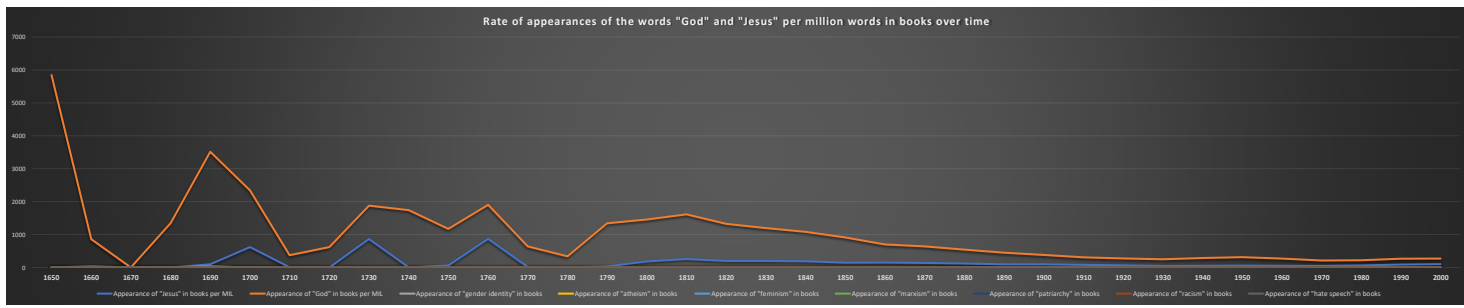
Shulamith Firestone - Pregnancy, childbirth, child-rearing is a disadvantage. Reproduction should be engineered 'systematically'. Never married, no kids. Lived in a commune until she died. No one found her in her apartment until it began to stink 8 days later.

Natalie Wolf - Beauty is an oppressive social construction imposed on women by men.

Beauty Myth: images of beauty are used against women.

John Stuart Mill - 'The Subjection of Women' 1869

One of the first male feminists. Note his position in the photograph which is contrary to most 19th century photos.
